These are the prints that I entered at WPPA State print competition....

'The Classic' was my best scoring print with an 82. 'Going Nowhere' scored a 78 as did Mutual Understanding. Our new fixer upper made the merit category with an 80. Both 'The Classic' and 'Our new fixer upper' will both hang at Nationals next Jan. I will make some changes to the other two per the judges instructions and with any luck, they will also score high enough in the national competition to 'hang'. The print judging this year was extremely tough this year, so I am satisfied with the results
